

Indy SCCA Solo Code of Conduct

In the SCCA Solo National Rules states:

“L. Unsportsmanlike Conduct. Any driver who drives unsafely at/near the event location or displays unsportsmanlike conduct shall be disqualified.” (Section 1.3.2)

The SCCA General Competition Rules Section 2 talks about Participant Conduct and states:

“Each participant shall conduct himself to the highest standards of behavior and sportsmanship. His actions shall not prejudice the reputation of the SCCA or the sport of automobile racing. Failure to comply may result in penalties as specified in Section 7; an official may, in addition, lose his assignment for that event.”

For a first offense: If a competitor displays unsportsmanlike conduct (unsafe driving, verbal abuse, physical violence...) it will be at the discretion of the Event Chair and Event Safety Stewards to determine the severity of the offense and choose a penalty based on those listed in the GCR Section 7.

For a second offense: If a competitor displays unsportsmanlike conduct it will be at the discretion of the Event Chair and Event Safety Steward that the competitor be suspended from ALL future events for that competition year.
