Clutch Chatter July issue got out early enough to reach all our members before the National Race Weekend, with extras printed for Programs at the races. Expenses are still well within the projected budget for the year. Dick requested everyone get the items for August in by July 21.

Website John is continuing to update the website. He requested everyone to continue sending him notes when they find discrepancies. Photos from our IGP Nationals are still loading to the website.

Membership Current membership is 473. We have had 12 members convert weekend memberships to full.

Activities Lou Byer is trying to set up an event later this year at Dismores in Greenfield.

The Last Checkered Flag - Butch Sumner

Butch (Minten A) Sumner passed away in Cincinnati over the weekend (July 26). Butch and his brother Jim started coming up to work races at IRP from Cincinnati in the late 1970's. Over the course of the next decade or so they could be found almost every weekend at an SCCA race at IRP, Mid-Ohio, or Nelson Ledges. As the 80's drew to a close Jim's family started getting older and he gradually stopped coming to the races. Butch continued on and eventually succeeded me as the IRO F&C Chief at IRP for the years 1987 to 1989. At some point in the 1990's we gained a second Sumner again, Butch's son Tim. Then Butch had a terrible bicycle accident that broke his jaw, required reconstructive surgery, and had him out for something like a year. He came back afterwards and continued working races until he was diagnosed with Alzheimer's several years ago. I think my fondest memory of Butch and his

brother Jim was at one of the US Grand Prix events at Detroit. I'm corner captain and my team is working a station clear on the other end of the race circuit from Butch and Jim. During one of the SCCA Trans-Am events my communicator starts relaying, there's a big wreck, turn whatever, pile up, cars on fire, full course yellow, etc. We just happened to be lucky enough to have one of those big Jumbo Tron TVs within view of our station. One of my crew looks up there at the big screen and yells "there's Butch and Jim on the Jumbo"! We all look up and there they are; they've popped out through their openings in the debris fencing and are putting out the fire. Needless to say "the Sumner boys" took a lot of ribbing at the beer party that evening over their Jumbo Tron fame. Of course anyone of us would have gladly traded places with them!

On Station: Indy Grand Prix Nationals by Bryan Deane



With our 4th of July National and Leap Laps Enduro in the record books it is time to turn our attention to the 2009 season. The region has decided for financial reasons to cancel the fall Regional. While I am personally disappointed, I certainly do concur with the decision. The region cannot afford to have a repeat of our Spring event in terms of car count or worker participation.

With that out of the way a quick recap of the July National. From a worker perspective the turnout was great! THANK YOU everyone! My boss (sort of speak) the Great Lakes DA Verne Wandell was in attendance and it was my first opportunity to meet him in person. Each of our manned stations had a minimum of 2 *experienced* flaggers per day with some stations having 3 or 4 people per day. The car count was respectable, the enduro on Saturday drew a nice field and was a great race. And the weather cooperated which was a tremendous bonus for us. Everyone I have spoken to regarding the event had nothing but high marks for the entire weekend. So now it's on to planning for 2009.

It is and has been my stated objective since being asked to be the Flag Chief in March to schedule a 2 day Flag & Fire school here, hopefully at ORP in conjunction with the Safety Staff at ORP. With the focus being not only on training, but recruiting new workers as well.

We've run this program in the past back east with tremendous success both from a training aspect but more importantly as a recruiting tool. The 4 regions that use Lime Rock Park, Mohawk-Hudson, New England, New York and Northern New Jersey banded together and approached

Lime Rock and their EMS staff with the idea of this type of program 6 years ago. It was well received by the track and the regions, obviously.

We then approached local marque clubs like the MG "T" Register, Jaguar Club, VSCCA, Porsche Club and BMW Car Club to join us at no cost to them for this training. The idea was to introduce these folks to what it is that we do and hopefully spark their interest into joining the SCCA and participating in our events as well as their own. And it worked!

In fact the first school 5 years ago netted 14 new flaggers for the regions of which 4 or 5 are still active. Then our second school in 2007 netted another 10 or 11 new flaggers and I believe most every one from that school is still active in the SCCA. The school is broken down into 3 modules and run 1 module at a time in an every other year schedule.

First the Basic Flagging School with just enough advanced content to keep the experienced people on their toes. The second school is the Intermediate School where the curriculum is a geared a little more toward the experienced folks, but not so much as to frighten off the new people. Finally the third module is the Advanced course which is still under development at this point for next spring's Flag & Fire School. Each module of the school is very interactive and hands on for the people that attend the school. There are lectures, demonstrations, skill building exercises (read fire), video role playing in a section know as "You Make the Call."

Each school is a full 2 day event. But more important it as a tremendous opportunity to not only recruit new people but to build an even better relationship with the EMS folks at ORP.

It is my intention to replicate the success of the NEDiv school here in the Great Lakes Division and have our region as the lead group in this effort. The dividends we potentially can reap from this are tremendous and I believe worth the time and effort.

Well, that's all for now. More about the Flag & Fire School in the months to come. Until then, hope to see all of you "On Station" real soon.

Dear Sheila

A car stalling after being driven a short distance can be caused by a variety of faults with the engine. Start by checking that there is no debris in the fuel line. If it is clear, check the vacuum pipes and hoses on the intake manifold and also check all grounding wires. If none of these approaches solves the problem, it could be that the fuel pump itself is faulty, causing low delivery pressure to the carburetor float chamber.

I hope this helps.

Well, this break was anything but intentional. To say that the weather has been less than helpful is to indulge in tremendous understatement. The July rally had 8 legs for the Course rally, 8 more for the Tour rally, plus the mandatory odometer calibration zone and tire warm-up zone. The tire warm-up was the ONLY part of the rally that did NOT go under water. As explained last month, most of it was still under water on June 14 which is when I had to take three weeks off to run events, for a family event, and the National Race. When I got back on the course on July 13 we had just experienced another major storm and five of the legs were under water again. But the course is finished and will be measured this weekend. Dan Cook will be pre-checking the course on Aug. 7. Please put August 24 (Sunday) on your schedules for the Jinxed Journey / Junket / Jaunt also known as J4-2 (Delayed).

The August event is again, a "universal" rally which means that you get to choose your category: Tour, Course, or GTA. We will continue our "training" program by changing the available main road determinants (MRD's). In March we used Protection, Right at T, and Straight as Possible. In April we used Onto, Left at T, and Straight as Possible. For June we used Onto, Protection, and Straight as Possible. Since several people expressed concerns about the meaning of Protection, we will make the August event Protection, Onto, and Straight as Possible.

Let's talk about Protection in some detail. The definition in the rules is: The SINGLE road (other than the one you arrive on) that does not have a STOP or YIELD sign. This requires that you be able to identify the sign by its shape in many cases, even when you are looking at an edge of the sign. And edges are frequently the basis of the trap. An example would be that you are approaching a T where you have to go either left or right (Straight would put you in the woods or a field) and either the left or the right has a stop or yield sign, but not both. This means that the main road goes in the direction that does not have the sign, and you cannot execute an instruction that takes you in the direction of the main road. So, if the instruction you are working on directs you to go left, and the road to the left is the one without a sign, you cannot execute the instruction at this intersection. You go left and look for another intersection at which the instruction takes you off of the main road.

Now, let's consider a more difficult example: MRD priorities for August are (Protection, Onto, SAP) and you are working on an instruction that directs you left as before. Only now, you are also Onto a road and when you come up to the T the road to the right with the Stop or Yield sign also has a sign identifying it as the road that you are Onto. You do the same thing as the first example because Protection is the highest priority and overrules the Onto. (This is why you evaluate the MRD list from the top; so you can quit as soon as one of them defines a main road.)

Now let's revise the second example by using the June priorities which were (Onto, Protection, SAP). In this case, the main road would be right by Onto, and you could execute the instruction "left" because it takes you off of the main road.

Subtle, yes. But this is why I suggest that you should have your children learn how to rally. It makes them observant of the road / intersection conditions, and it develops mental clarity. This will allow them to make better use of the physical reactions that they are endowed with. Especially when combined with solo training.

There is an open seat in the Contour for the Sept. 5 / 6 Michigan event known as the POR (Press On Regardless). This is a two night, almost entirely in the dark, event that will be running for the 60th consecutive year. I am looking for somebody who would like to learn how to run the computer and willing to commit to navigating this event.

The General Instructions for the August rally will be posted on the web site by August 9. Feel free to study these and e-mail questions to me by Aug. 21, particularly if you intend to run either the Course or GTA events. Questions should be in a form that can be answered yes, no, or will not occur. I will post the answers at registration. Feel free to fill in a Registration Form on-line and e-mail it to me as well (Tour or Course competitors need to use the ELSN form. GTA competitors need to use the EN form.). Then all I have to do at registration is see your drivers license, collect your money, and have you sign the liability waiver (and fill out a temporary membership form if you are not a member).

Firm dates for 2008: (These events count up to 10 points toward the National Championship) as well as for the Regional Championship and for Competitor of the Year.

As an explanation of the last event; there is a season ending event called the USRRC (United States Road Rally Challenge) that is held the third weekend in October (moved to last weekend this year). All events occurring after that are scored for the following years championship.

For those of you who would like to do more rallying, but would like to stay within day-trip radius, there is a Champaign County Sports Car Club in Champaign, IL that is putting on a pretty nice series of events. I am going over for one Friday evening (July 25) and they have another event scheduled for Sunday Aug. 10. Runoffs Qualification Explained

The Runoffs are the SCCA Amateur Championships, with the best drivers from the 8 Divisions in each of 25 classes competing for the title National Champion. The Runoffs are an Invitational meet, and the drivers must meet certain qualifications to get the invitation.

The Driver must have qualified for 4 National Races in the year, and Finished 3 of them. At least 2 of the races must have been in the drivers Division of record. A driver who finishes within the top 10 in points, but does not have the required 4 starts, does not qualify for the runoffs. A driver could be 5th in points on only 3 races. Without the 4th race, he is not eligible for the runoffs.

The Driver must be in the top 10 in points in his Division, counting no more than 2 out of Division races, and have a minimum of 4 points. Points are awarded for finishing First (12 Points), 2nd (9), 3rd (7), and decreasing 1 point per position from 4th thru ninth. Only the Drivers best 6 finishes are counted for the points total.

TOPEKA, Kan. – Sports Car Club of America, Inc. has launched a new program designed to encourage membership growth by rewarding current members who refer new members to the organization.

To qualify for the program, the new member may not have been an SCCA member in the previous 18 months.

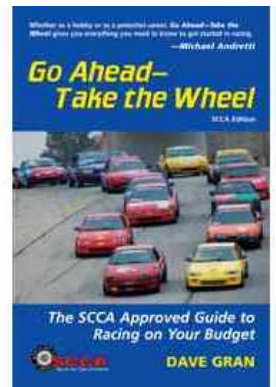
In order to receive credit for referring a new member, the recruit must provide your name and membership number when they sign up. This may be done via SCCA.com (preferred), phone, fax or mail.
