Dave has had contact with the State Fairgrounds; lot rental for autocross would be \$1400 per day for a (very) small lot. This is not feasible for our club.



The 2012 season is starting to take off for us with the first three events stand so far: Indy Region points event taking place in early May. For the competitors that are not content with seven points events June 23/24 Silverdome, Pontiac/MI and maybe a couple of additional fun events, there are July 15 plenty of other opportunities to get an autocross fix, be it August 17-19 nearby with a neighboring region, or possibly further away at a National-level event. Just like last year, I expect that I have never been to an event at the Silverdome, the forsome of us will venture out and represent the Indy Region mer Detroit Lions football arena in Pontiac, but am looking name at events as far as Lincoln in Nebraska.

Regional Events:

Yes, going outside our region usually means driving a little farther for an event. However, events can still be found at reasonable distances away from Indy. In fact, some of the closest out-of-region events take place at Grissom, one of our regular sites, where other regions also put on Solo events. In addition, if you live closer to the outskirts of our region, events in neighboring regions can be even closer to your home than some of the Indy Region events. Some of the regions you may want to check out are Columbus Sports Car Club, where the first two events of their season have already taken place, Fort Wayne Region, South Bend Region, Indiana Northwest Region, Western Ohio Region, Cincinnati Region, Ohio Valley Region, Northwest Ohio Region, Central Illinois Region, Southern Indiana Region and Kentucky Region.

There are a number of ways to find out about events in other regions. Some of the available resources are:

Schedule information can also be looked up directly on the regions' Web sites, which can be found through a search engine, or through the scca.com Web site. Another possibility to find out about these events is talking to other autocrossers, either directly or through the various discussion

Divisional Events:

There will be changes at the Divisional level this year. For the first time in many years, there will be no Divisional Championship. The National Office has decided to eliminate the qualification requirements for attending the National Championships. In the past, it was necessary to either attend a Divisional Championship or a National Tour in order to compete in the National Championship, and therefore, the Divisions were required to hold Divisional Championships, but no more.

With this change, the Divisions are still encouraged to hold events that bring competitors from the various regions together. This will happen in our area in form of the Great well over 20 years. At the writing of this article, the schedule had not been completely finalized, but the following

forward to experiencing it. This site is also used by Detroit Region for their local series events. It might be similar to the Coliseum in Fort Wayne, also a venue used for concerts and other large events, which has a quite large parking lot with an asphalt surface. Oscoda, on the other hand, is closer to Grissom in nature, also a former Air Force base with an expansive concrete pad, but in very good shape and with good grip. Oscoda is a pretty good distance from Indy, but worth the trip. A fourth event might be added to the list, with the Toledo Express Airport being a likely venue. Please note that preregistration is often required at the Divisional level. You don't want to show up and not be able to run after making a long trip because you overlooked this little detail.

National Events:

There are three types of National-level events, National Tours, ProSolos, and the National Championships. This year, there will be ten National Tours spread out over the country, with two of them already in the books in more southern states with no attendees from our region. There will also be nine ProSolos, which includes the ProSolo Finale in Lincoln. This all culminates in the National Championships towards the end of the season.

Out of the ten National Tours, I expect to see Indy Region drivers at four of them. The first one is the Lincoln NT or Central States Championship (I've also heard the name Spring Nationals), which takes place over the Memorial Day weekend in Lincoln, Nebraska. This will be the second time the Spring Nationals are held, again in combination with a ProSolo. The fact that the event takes place at the same place as the Solo Nationals, and the combination with the ProSolo for a total of four days of competition in a row both add to the attractiveness of this event, despite the far-away location.

Just two weeks later, in June, the NT schedule continues with an event in Blytheville Arkansas, the Southern States Championships. Blytheville has been on the NT schedule for several years now with several of us attending on a regular basis. Apparently, the National Office deemed the NT/ProSolo combo they first tried at last year's Spring Na-Lakes Divisional Series, an autocross series that goes back tionals, a success, since they are using the same format for the event in Blytheville this year.

In addition, the National Office decided to officially try stock Championships this year. classes, in which cars are grouped together based on their driveline configuration. There will be RTR for rear-wheel drive cars, RTF for front-wheel drive cars and RTA for allwheel drive cars. The cars competing in these new classes must meet the stock class requirements with the additional rule that the tires have a minimum 140 treadwear rating, regular Stock classes. These new classes cater to people ter, but at the time of the event. who don't opt to run R-compound tires on their cars and are therefore not competitive in the regular Stock classes. I hope that the new classes increase the participation of Indy Just like last season, I'll try to cover the relevant Divisional Region drivers at the Peru NT. I expect that the National Office will make these classes permanent if they are accepted by the membership through good entry levels, otherwise, they will probably disappear again.

The Solo season really winds down throughout most of the country after the National Championships, but there is one more NT to go to, the second Blytheville NT in Arkansas on October 27/28. We might find Indy Region members down about. there again for a last large-scale concrete event before they park their cars for the winter break.

It has been a few years since we had Indy Region members compete seriously in the ProSolo series. We'll see if this changes this year with the two combined NT/ProSolo events in Lincoln and Blytheville. If someone decides to run the full ProSolo series, they will be in Lincoln for the ProSolo Finale on September 1/2. This event is followed by the Solo National Championships, which take place from September 4 to 6, which is Labor Day week. I expect a number of Indy Region drivers to be there to measure themselves against the best in the country. This is just too good of an event to pass up. Information for Area 4 Members

I just returned from the SCCA National Convention. While it was only 3 days for most attendees, it was 7 days for members of the BOD Planning Committee, most of it in hotel meeting rooms. There is much to tell so here goes.

Reunification of Central Division

Last month, I conducted a Straw Pole among Great Lakes Division RE's, newsletter editors, and other leaders of the Division. The guestions was "Should we reunite Area 4 (Great Lakes Division) and Area 5 (Central Division)?" The results:

56% For 26% Against

17% Ambivalent

At the same time, a poll was taken in Area 5. The result of that poll was 70% against. And that kills this discussion for now. Area 5 Director Bob Lybarger and I continue to discuss the matter, but without buy-in from Area 5, we can go no further. It takes two to dance.

There is some discussion among the BOD about gerrymandering parts of NeDiv such that western Pennsylvania would become part of GLD. I spoke with some attendees from Steel Cities and Mahoning Valley regions at the convention and they liked the idea. It would also add BeaveRun to our racetracks. Don't get too excited as this is just "beer talk" right now.

The BOD is engaged with determining who GLD would be paired with as the Majors are deployed. The favorite is Central Division. So reunified or not, we may find ourselves clustered with CenDiv anyway. The other possibility is NeDiv, but the numbers are not lining up well in terms of distribution of drivers for given classes.

Bluegrass Motorsports Park

While at the Convention, I received a call from Brad Poppell at BMPS. Brad says the lawsuit holding up construction at the track has been settled in their favor (yeah!). Work is about to resume. We agreed to meet in about 60 days to discuss the SCCA's potential ownership position. This is great news for our Kentucky Regions, Cincy Region, WOR, and even Indy Region.

Convention - BOD

My convention started Monday night with meetings by the BOD Planning Committee. As expected, we devoted quite a bit of time to a rollout of the Majors, the change in the Runoffs format, and the realignment of classes. The BOD meetings, which began Wednesday, considered all the items you will read about in Fas-Track. There were many reports from all the various committees, staff and program boards. I made a presentation of a new business model that would have great appeal to a younger demographic, while providing the SCCA with excellent public relations. It was received well. Of particular interest, was consideration of a tiered membership program which would cut the cost of membership for many members. The full impact of this concept will be vetted by the staff and we will decide later this year if the program has merit.

This BOD is good. As a group, they listen and are not afraid to make the bold moves necessary to improve our club. And, my fellow members are committed like I am to a rules season and a reduction of National classes.

SOLO

One of the goals to improve our Solo Program was to fully integrate scheduling and information dissemination through the same channels as our Club Racing program. We are working to use the GLD website as the central point for posting and receiving Solo information. Our webmaster, Dayle Frame, is on-board with this idea and we will make it happen. We will also discuss revamping the layout of the website with Bob Burns to make it easier to use. We had a number of very productive meetings at the Convention with RE's of predominantly Solo Regions. Thank you all for your input and ideas!
