

# PDX/TT Report CJ Harleman

A Happy December to my fellow Time Trial Racers from your Time Trials Chair! I know what you're thinking, "Our what? Time Trials Chair? What's a Time Trial and since when do we have a Time Trials program or a Chair?"

Allow me to explain. In early 2014, the Club held a Time Trials meeting at the Dusterburg's place. Does anyone remember that meeting? It was after the meeting where we learned about the timing equipment from Stef, Chris, and Colin. After we noshed on Subway and desserts until we were in a coma? No? You missed it?? Dang! Y'all gotta get to the D's place when they host a throw down. Epic (I bet you missed the Club outing day too—with the drag tree reaction time races, and road rally scavenger hunt, and bbq, and beer, and matchbox racing, and Raleigh and Bruce doing burn outs in their classic muscle restos in the school parking lot, and the Banker's newest over-powered beauty and...sigh...you missed it. Tragic, just tragic.)

However, I digress: back to the subject at hand. During that club meeting, Dave discussed the newly forming Time Trials program within the SCCA. He asked me if I would be interested in doing some research into the viability of bringing the program to the Indy Region. My 2014 automotive calendar was already booked solid, but felt that I could squeeze in some research in anticipation of getting a program off the ground for 2015. I accomplished much of that research in a bit of a vacuum at odd hours stuffed in between life/racing/solo/work/kids/school work for my Master's degree, etc. You get the drift. Over the summer, I applied for and received my Time Trial Apprentice licensing and Time Trial Novice Driver's permit (I didn't need the Novice permit, but I went through the application process for the experience). After a bit more background work for the program, and once the dust from the already-overly-filled summer schedule settled, I was prepared to jump into the actual meat-n-taters of the program and make some connections.

To offer a bit of background on the SCCA's Time Trials (TT) program, I will give you a few liner notes. This new experience outlet will run under its own directorship on the divisional level instead of under the Club Racing Board's directors. That might not mean much to many of you, but some may remember that the SCCA gave the PDX/Club Trial/Track Trial/Hill Climb thing a shot in the past under the CRB and it did not fly (for many reasons that I won't get into here). This time, the SCCA is developing this program as a stand-alone product and the Time Trials Program Manager for GLDiv, Jerry Cabe, is ready to party! What does that mean to you? In a nutshell: a 4 page rule book (including the cover and the appendix) and (as close to) zero hoops for participants as you have in Solo, AND...support for local Program Chairs (like me) to get a program up and running. What does the Club need to do? Until we are able to run our own program with our own local TT Stewards, we will host a site, coordinate a date, call on the GLDiv support team, and get participants. What do you need to do? Show up with safety gear and a safe car and drive: fast. Sound interesting? Read on!

Some of you have never attended a Performance Driving Experience (PDX) event. I would hazard a guess than many of our current Solo drivers have no formal 'track time' under their belt. My hope is to change that by offering opportunities for local track experiences and hill climb events. To that ends, let me tell you about my apprenticeship weekend with the SCCA's Time Trial program in Kentucky.

In November, the KYSCCA, in conjunction with the National Office, held an experimental program called "Starting Line Track School" at the new National Corvette Museum Motorsports Park (NCM for short). Alongside the experimental program, they ran a PDX day; the SCCA's entry level offering in the Time Trials program. I volunteered at the PDX event to gain some experience toward my TT Safety Steward licensing and I spent my day with our GLDiv TT Safety Steward, Dave Howard. What a fountain of knowledge! We discussed many aspects of the TT Safety program and how it compared to both Solo SS and Club Racing SS programs. During the event, my job as safety steward apprentice included doing many aspects of the TTSS job. I listened in while Dave gave the safety steward chat during the pre-event driver's meeting. I drove the course in Heyward's rental car to evaluate the passing zones and apex cones placement. On my recommendation, based on my actually wheel-to-wheel race experience on the track two weeks before, Dave and I went out, adjusted the passing zones to improve the safety of the course, and tweaked the cones

marking the Pit-In. I walked the paddock to make sure no one was working on a car in an unsafe manner. I assisted race control in deciding to call in drivers for unsafe maneuvers on course. I held a few of the 'come to Jesus' meetings with offending driver in the pit lane to discuss the error(s) of their driving. Heck, we even had a car go up in flames! That resulted in some real life experience in doing post-incident paperwork. No one was injured I am happy to report. There *is* one less SHO Taurus on the planet though. Tech note: worn out power steering pump lines WILL overheat and fail under track conditions. When they burst under pressure, atomized hydraulic fluid makes one helluva flamethrower! I came away with some good experience and a better understanding of how the SCCA puts on a Time Trial PDX event.

The KYSCCA's members worked the flagging stations. For many, this was their first time ever in a flag stand. During a TT PDX, flags are minimal. We chose to use the green flag to start the session, red flag to end the session, black flag to signal a car to go see the safety steward, and the yellow flag to signal an unsafe track condition to the drivers. The newly christened flaggers did a great job. Their reward was free track time and free food (remember kids...volunteering has some sweet rewards!).

I briefly met and spoke with Brian Mason from KYSCCA. Brian and KYSCCA are developing a TT program in their local area. We plan to collaborate for events in 2015 at NCM. NCM is a convenient location and a fantastic track. Bowling Green Kentucky is in the honeymoon phase with this new racetrack and it is refreshing to see the public come out on a weekend to spectate amateur racing. The local news crew has been there for both events I attended there this year. By collaborating with KYSCCA in 2015, both clubs can provide a better TT experience for interested members within the GLDiv. I will keep the Club up to speed on this collaboration as it develops and as we secure new locations for events.

A side note about the Starting Line Track School. At the event, I met Heyward Wagner, Director of Experiential Programs for the SCCA. The SCCA hired Heyward in May of 2014 to head up the new Experiential Programs department. This department's aim is developing 'experience' programs to encourage more ways for SCCA members to participate and socialize with each other in non-competitive environments with their cars (http://www.scca.com/news/?cid=51857). The Starting Line Track School is the SCCA's take on entry-level. instructor led car control school aimed at track work as opposed to solo work. The program does not replace wheel-to-wheel competition-focused race schools such as Skip Barber. It intends to prepare drivers for noncompetitive driving experiences such as PDX and Club Trials. Think Evo School for the track and you will have a very good understanding of the focus of the Starting Line Track School. During the school, the students had classroom time, skid pad, car control, performance braking, pedal/wheel control, and corner entry/exit practice followed by track time with both instructor lead "lead-follow" sessions and open track sessions. The Track School students do not drive on the track with the PDX participants, and the PDX runs as a separate, concurrent event. As with all PDX events, the drivers are divided into Novice, Intermediate/Advanced groups. Because the PDX portion of the TT program is non-competitive, it falls within the 'experiential' heading and thus is a perfect add-on event to the Starting Line Track School. As our program grows, I will work with Heyward as he develops and expands the Starting Line Track School into new markets. With time, the Club hopes to host a Starting Line Track School/PDX day locally.

Now, what do I need from the Club to make this work? I need volunteers of course but, even more than that, I need you to come out and drive! I would love to have you to come to the board meetings and participate. Ask questions. Get involved. Our Time Trials program can be as large or as small a program as we want it to be. Sure, just about anyone can book a track and hold a PDX. The Time Trials program has much more to offer than simple PDX events. We're talking Club Trials (non-competitive timed events), Track Trials (track based competitive timed events), and Hill Climbs (separate start/end point style competitive timed events - like Pike's Peak and the Tail of the Dragon). Talk to me and tell me what you, the members, want the program to become. Several years ago I had the chance to drive with N.A.S.A. at a PDX type event at Putnam Park. I had a great time and even though I was driving my under powered Ford Mustang front wheel drive replacement, yes all 164HP of it. The Probe (Prepare Replacements On Basically Everything) was still a fun car, it handled well and it was very forgiving, but not real fast. It was a great experience, there were several experienced drivers available for ride along teaching but the only flager was the guy at pit exit. Several corner workers were at the appropriate places but they just watched. I'm not sure if medical or emergency personnel were even there. There wasn't any tech inspection but we did have a drivers meeting, kinda. The NASA people told us a bit about track safety and said do not pass in the corners but a real thorough track safety and how to drive was left up to the individual and if one could get a experienced driver to ride with you then all the better. The man that rode with me told me he had no wheel-to-wheel race experience. He did have a hot Corvette and I assumed his experience must have been having fun with the Corvette Club. Looking back and after reading CJ piece, that event was positively dangerous! Like I said it was still a great experience and definitely fun and I would probably do it again with or without the proper teaching. But Cj's experience and the promise that it holds has me ery excited. Chasing cones is nice but until you can actually get on a track and feel your car working in the corners and the acceleration down the straight you haven't lived! I for one do want this program to succeed and I hope we have plenty of others that agree with me

#### **Region Officer Job Descriptions**

It's getting near that time of year when Regions are considering new officer candidates for 2015. To help us recruit new leaders, we present the following Job Descriptions for Region Officers. This list is by no means comprehensive, and is only offered as a guide for us during the upcoming elections.

#### **Regional Executive**

- ·Chief Executive Officer of the Region.
- ·Official Spokesperson for the Region.
- ·Presides at all meetings of Members and Directors.
- ·Shall report on the status of the Region at each meeting.
- Shall call any special meeting of Members and Directors in accordance with the Bylaws of the Region.
- Prepares and adheres to agendas for all meetings.
- ·Shall appoint or discharge necessary and appropriate positions and committees.
- ·Shall sign and execute, together with the Treasurer (or his assignee), all contracts, notes, and drafts in the name of the Region.
- ·With the Treasurer, participate in creating and assist to determine the Region's budget for the coming year.
- Shall perform or cause to be performed all duties assigned to him/her by the Sports Car Club of America, Inc.
- ·Shall cause books, statements, reports and other Certificates and records to be filed as required by law.
- ·Shall complete (with aid of Assistant RE) Region SCCA Charter Documents and submit to the National Office no later than February 15th of each year.
- Shall complete SCCA Directory information for the Region and submit to the National Office no later than December 31st of each year.
- Shall enforce Region's Bylaws and perform all duties incidental to the office of Regional Executive.
- ·Shall supervise all activities of the Region.
- Shall have other such duties and authorities as pre -scribed by Bylaws or Regions Board of Directors.
- Work closely with Region Board of Directors to create and monitor one year and five year plans using guidelines offered in the Mission Statement and Strategic Plan of SCCA, Inc.
- ·Communicate as needed with Executive Officers of other local sports car clubs, SCCA Regions, and SCCA Divisions.
- ·Shall maintain communications with the responsible SCCA Area Director.

#### **Assistant Regional Executive**

- ·Performs duties of the Regional Executive in that person's absence or incapacity.
- ·Performs other such duties as assigned by the Regional Executive.
- ·Performs duties as assigned by the Region's Board of Directors.
- ·Shall attend all meetings of the Members and Directors.
- With the Regional Executive, shall prepare the Region's

SCCA Charter Documents and submit to the National Office no later than February 15th of each year.

·Work closely with Region Board of Directors to create and monitor one year and five year plans using guidelines offered in the Mission Statement and Strategic Plan of SCCA, Inc.

#### Secretary

- ·Shall keep minutes of meetings of Members and Directors.
- Shall be the custodian of all records of the Region.
- ·Shall attend all meetings of the Members and Directors.
- ·Work closely with the RE and Region Board of Directors to create and monitor one year and five year plans using guidelines offered in the Mission Statement and Strategic Plan of SCCA, Inc.
- ·Shall maintain the Region's calendar of events.
- ·Shall submit the Region's calendar to newsletter and website.

#### Treasurer

- ·Shall have care and custody of, and be responsible for all funds, merchandise, and assets of the Region.
- ·Shall have custody of monies, debts, and financial obligations of the Region.
- Shall attend all meetings of the Members and Directors.
- ·Reports financial status of Region to Members and Directors.
- Shall maintain accounting records in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.
- ·Pays listing or sanctioning fees in advance of any SCCA event.
- ·Shall transmit dues and income information received from the SCCA National office to the Region's Membership Chairperson.
- ·Shall make monthly, or more often if required, deposits to the Region's bank account.
- Obtain tax exemption certificate if required.
- ·With the Regional Executive, participate in creating and assist to determine the Region's budget for the coming year.
- ·Work closely with the RE and the Region Board of Directors to create and monitor one year and five year plans using guidelines offered in the Mission Statement and Strategic Plan of SCCA, Inc
- Shall ensure preparation and filing of tax returns in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code of the United States and other controlling jurisdictions.
- ·Shall notify the Region's bank(s) when changes are made with respect to addresses, signatures, and other contact information for new officers or check signers.
