



We were disappointed that none of the three parties that expressed interest by email showed up, but since nobody else did either, we have a rally school sitting here on the shelf that we can pull out and present on very short notice. Let us know that you want us to do it!



The May rally is being planned to lie between I-70 and I-74, and west of I-465 (i.e. towards Crawfordsville. As indicated below, we will start at the Trader's Point Shopping Center on the north side of 86th St. Look for the orange checkpoint signs near the east traffic light. Truth in advertising: There will be unpaved roads! Sometimes they are actually smoother than some of the paved county roads. In fact, when Judy and I were out scouting roads on Tuesday, we were pleasantly surprised to find the county road crews out grooming the unpaved roads; i.e. grading them. Found some very interesting roads that haven't been used on an Indy Region event in at least the last 18 years, and probably a lot longer than that. Here is a chance to be a pioneer.

<u>Competitive</u> Road Rally comes in three flavors or categories; <u>C</u>ourse, <u>G</u>ame-Tour-Adventure, and <u>T</u>our. Look for the underlined letters in the schedule printed below to see what your available options are each month. Where all three are listed, that means that all three will be available for choice on that date (an option that is currently available only in Indianapolis Region).

<u>Non-competitive</u> Road Rally can include destination tours to interesting places such as museums, wineries, etc. They will generally be run as "Social" rallies since the purposes are mostly built around social interaction. If somebody knows of such an interesting destination and would like to help us put on such an event, please volunteer (or just bring it to our attention so that we can research interest). The Region has done such events in the past to places like Mammoth Cave, KY and to the Dayton Air Museum.

Dragcross Report 4/18/2015 Dave D

The weather was perfect as 73 entries were set to battle for the first of three 2015 Dragcross championships. The field was as diverse as it always with everything from daily driver stockers to mod cars. The variety of people who made up the entrants were just as diverse. Dragcross attracts a large number of new people and that's part of why we have Dragcross, to attract people who might not otherwise consider our events.

Qualifying set the fields for each of the five eliminators with sixteen cars in the first four and a seven car fifth eliminator. Entrants get for passes, two on each course, and the quickest time from each course are added together to become the entrant's qualifying time. In this case, positions one through seventy three. Then the eliminator fields are set by breaking the qualified field into eight or sixteen car fields. So for this event there were four sixteen car eliminators and a single seven car eliminator with a bye in the first round. The eliminators were broken down with 1-16, 17-32, etc. The eliminators are run heads up and DNFs or hitting cones is an automatic loss. If a competitor loses in the first round of their eliminator they have the chance to fight their way back to the Championship Eliminator via the Last Chance Eliminator. Most events there more than enough cars to make multiple Last Chance Eliminators, this event was no exception. There were two L.C.s and the winners of each of those battled to see who would move on to the Championship Eliminator.

The number one qualifier was none other than Clemens Burger in his LeGrand Mk18. Dragcross has a history where the number one qualifier has never won the Championship and this held true as Clemens coned out in the final of the first eliminator against eventual Champion, Dan Stone, who qualified 7th co-driving Clemens car. The second Eliminator saw Cobra driver Joe Hirsh who came from the 16th position in the eliminator to best number 7 in the eliminator, Paul Gibson piloting an RX-8. In third Eliminator action, Parker Harwood in a BRZ from the 14th position, outran Nick Prives' Accord who fought from the #9 position. In the 4th Eliminator, Neon driver Justin Wrighton from the #1 position trailered BRZ driver Nishanth Samala who came from the 5th position. The 5th Eliminator saw drivers come from the #3 and #4 spots where Grant Kimsley (#3) in a Mini bested Mike Whitaker (#4) in a Mustang. There were two Last Chance Eliminators which each produced a winner and those two battled to see who would go on to the Championship Eliminator. That war was waged between Steven Ruschak in a Miata and Derek Hale also in a Miata with Ruschak victorious moving on to the Championship Eliminator.

The Championship Eliminator final wound up pitting Dan Stone against Grant Kimsley. Stone wound up uncontested going into the final as Wrighton's Neon developed clutch issues. On the other side of the ladder, Kimsley had to park both Hirsch's Cobra and Harwood's BRZ on his way to the final. The entire Championship Eliminator is run handicapped with the handicap calculated from each driver's previous round times. This gave Kimsley a theoretical 17.119 second head start over Stone. Kimsley came up .795 short with Stone's winning 50.064 over Kimsley's 50.859.

During eliminations, there's a competition inside the competition and that's the Reaction Time Derby. We present a trophy to the driver who posts the best reaction time to the starting line Christmas tree during eliminations. This time around the winner was Jim Eicher in his Mustang GT.
