July 2017 Indy Region Board Meeting

Approval of May Minutes – minutes from June meeting were approved.

Old Business – None

Website – No notes from John.

Clutch Chatter – Maggie thanked everyone for getting reports to her. If you have an article you would like added the CC please send it to her. Maggie said she's really enjoying doing CC. Now that Maggie is feeling more comfortable with everything she will be taking over all aspects (sending out the printed copies of CC).

Membership – Matt announced that we have 561 current members. We have gained about 8 new members but didn't lose too many last month. Matt sent out 3 emails to routine weekend members. Seems to be seeing a good trend.

Treasurer's Report – Colin opened another CD. Credit card is all paid up. No outstanding receipts, some un-cashed checks though. Rally and Time Trial are both negative right now, Solo is positive. Programs still have events to hold, so no worries yet. Colin noticed that all programs submit budgets, but Admin doesn't have one. We haven't really tracked it well, or at all. He is going to start tracking to see where money is going and create a budget for these funds.

Activities

-Annual Banquet – Colin met with Vinnie to go through his findings for venues and catering. They were able to narrow venues to two, as well as two caterers. The dates they are looking at are January 13th or 27th, 2018. First option is Sycamore Room at Mallow Run. This location isn't inside the circle, but is the same distance away as Squealers was. It is close to Whiteland. Seats roughly 300 and has lots of parking. Very

willing to work with us. Second option is Willows on Westfield in Broadripple. There are 2 room options (large ballroom or small room), and both would suffice. Willows does have a caterer that we are required to use. At Mallow Run we can chose our caterer. The option would be Nameless Catering with a BBQ buffet. The BoD voted and decided to use Syamore Room at Mallow Run with Nameless Catering on January 27, 2018. The costs for attendees will be the same as years past at \$25/person. Unsure on what/if there

will be a child discount. Decisions will be made soon on that.

Social Media – Chris said that Vinnie is doing a good job posting about upcoming events on the Facebook page. The Rally posts of Facebook have been getting good response/discussion.

Runoffs – Bryan reports that the first list of qualified drivers (822) is now out. Registration opens on July 19th. Dave is working on the block party for Sept 25th. Going to engage the local businesses. Velma is going to be meeting with the Speedway Chamber for the hospitality info. She is still looking for help with our hospitality booth during the Runoffs.

Solo – Stefanie reported that Points event 2 at the Fairgrounds went fairly well. There were 86 competitors at this event. There were some issues with timing, but managed to get things managed. Stefanie will be holding an advanced timing course for a few select individuals. She would like to slowly get more people more comfortable with the system to assure multiple people can solve different issues that may arise. The two day Divisional event had a great turn out with 128 on Saturday and 149 on Sunday. This was used as our Charity event. The Peru PD K9 Unit was chosen as they have to support their canines on donations alone. One of the officers (Sgt. Raber) came out both days with her dog Fargo. They did bite demonstrations both days and also a drug sniffing demonstration on Sunday. We were able to donate almost \$1500 (\$5/competitor each day, plus some extra chipped in by competitors). All events in June/July profited. Upcoming events are the CAM Challenge, Hoosier Challenge (hosted by SBR), Test N Tune and Subaru Challenge.

Rally – Wendy said they have about 14-15 cars registered for the National Rally (July 15) and have some new names for the Divisional Rally (July 16). She could use 1 or 2 more for checkpoints. Meeting at Holiday Inn in Greenwood at 930am. Ted is gearing up for the annual Halloween Rally. He is hoping to have 40 cars. He is wanting to rent

out the township building and do some family friendly food for after the rally. This event is scheduled for Oct 28th.

PDX – CJ reported that we have one on Aug 26th at Putnam. Still waiting on registrations, but most don't sign up until the last week. CJ did announce that she will not be chairing the program next year. She will be looking for another Chair and is willing to help with Stewarding. Michael Young has expressed interest in Chairing the

Runoffs Welcome Party layout

- A. 130 x 350ft: Bike barricaded off pedestrian area where party will be hosted.
- B. 30x30 tent + 100 chairs
 - space for entertainment (most likely a DJ, but potentially a live band)
- C. Parking (gravel area: 125 x 380ft and 100 x 360 ft.)
 - Access from 16th St and Main St.
- D. Port-a-Potties (6) and wash station (1)
- Street will not be blocked to public traffic because:
 - Indy Car Experience has a large party planned at their space on 9/24-25 during the day (400-600 guests).
 - Closing the street is cost prohibitive and unnecessary for our purposes.
