

# **SPECIAL WORDS FROM VELMA**



The much-anticipated event for the Sport Car Club of America at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway finally happened the end of September. The 54<sup>th</sup> running of the 2017 Runoffs at IMS was a huge success in the eyes of SCCA, IMS, the competitors and the workers. The National staff rolled in the weekend of September 17<sup>th</sup> to begin the process of getting everything set up before competitors started arriving on Wednesday, September 20<sup>th</sup>. This is the culmination of more than two years of planning, many trips to Indianapolis and countless meetings to make this event successful. AND IT WAS A SUCCESS!

The week started out with four "test" days at the track. These test days were for the competitors who chose to spend a little extra money and get a look at the track before qualifying began. Thursday through Sunday were set aside for the test days and the field was full for all four days! Of course, the



weather was more like July weather but at least it was clear and sunny – no rain! Bryan Dean had the responsibility of making sure that the corners were manned at all times while cars were on course. As usual, he did a great job! Raleigh and I volunteered to work a couple of the test days -Raleigh worked a corner station and I worked grid with CJ. Neither of us had ever worked anything other than timing and scoring so this was new for us. Working grid offered me a great opportunity to talk with drivers and spend time with some drivers I knew from other SCCA venues. Working corners gave Raleigh the opportunity to buy a white pair of painter's pants so if he decides to pursue that as a new career, he already has the uniform!

Monday, the first day of qualifying, found Raleigh working Pit Tech. We worked this specialty last year at Mid-Ohio and really enjoyed being that close to the action. In fact, Raleigh worked Pit Tech all seven days. Just ask him how many steps he got on his Fitbit! While Raleigh was working on Monday, CJ and I were busy getting the Welcome Party finalized. I want to thank John Wilmoth and Darren Daubenspeck for coming to help with some of the heavy lifting in the afternoon. We had beer vouchers from Dare Devil Brewing, pop and water and munchies from Tacos and Tequila. All very good food! I'm not sure of the final head count but there were lots of people in that parking lot on Main Street! In fact, Mike Cobb, our new president at SCCA, was handing out beer vouchers so he had the opportunity to meet lots of SCCA people. In addition to Mike, Doug Boles, president of IMS, was also at the Welcome Party to greet people.

The Welcome Party gave those visiting IMS for the first time the chance to see what other restaurants and shops were on Main Street. According to the Chamber of Commerce, the restaurants on Main Street were busy all week.

Racing finally began on Friday! I'm quite sure that all of the races got their total of 19 laps in and none of the races were called after 40 minutes of competition. That is something that doesn't always happen but it worked at IMS because of the Fire and Rescue teams that IMS provided. If a car/driver needed rescuing, those teams were out and working on getting the track back to full green very quickly. At any other track, there are several races that would have been called on time rather than getting all of the prescribed laps in. Kudos to the IMS Fire and Rescue! Indy Region had 26 competitors participate in the Runoffs – and 1 used-to-be-Indy-Region competitor. That is a great showing for our Region. We do have one National Champion with **Dave Daughtery** in B-Spec and several other competitors who finished well. The fact that these drivers were able to compete at IMS is definitely on a bucket list for them and we should be proud of all of them.
