Sitting in the Garage with:

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

This month's conversation is with Ron McManus. Ron is a new member for the Indy Region in 2020. Ron and his girlfriend Megan run a bright red Z06 Corvette in Solo events.

Give me some background info.

I lived in Joliet, IL for the first 13 years of my life until my Mother relocated to small town in Iowa (population 5000, farming community, 1 stop light, 1 gas station, 1 grocery store...) After I graduated from high school, I really wanted to buy a brand-new Honda Civic Si so I got a full-time job working at a factory. After a year, I realized I still couldn't afford that Civic Si so I decided I needed to go to college to afford it. I signed up for a Fire Science course in Waterloo, IA and relocated there. After receiving my degree, I found it very difficult to get into a fire department since it's a very competitive career field. I decided to join the Air Force as a firefighter to travel the world, so they sent me to Tampa, FL lol. I loved it still. I left the Air Force after 4 years and I went straight to Iraq as a contractor doing the same firefighting job on a military base near Baghdad. After spending 4 years in Iraq, I decided to move to Indy since my sister already lives here and there's no way that I'm moving to IL lol. I spent the first 6 months of 2020 studying for EMT and autocrossing at as many events as COVID would allow. I finally landed a firefighting job working for Eli Lilly, there's more than 120 Eli Lilly owned buildings in Indy. Yep, still haven't bought my new Honda Civic yet...

How long have you been a member of SCCA?

Officially I have been a member of SCCA since 2007

What activities do you participate in with Indy Region?

At this moment, I only participate in autocrosses since track days are kind of intimidating. My very first and only "track day" was at the Nürburgring where I rented an E46 M3 for a day. I tried to prep myself for weeks to try and remember the track, but I was still lost lol.

How did you get interested in cars and the SCCA?

My very first car was an 87 Acura Integra and I quickly turned into a Honda-boy. The next 2 vehicles were Acura Integra's. Growing up in middle of nowhere Iowa, there really wasn't a car scene besides big diesel trucks blowing black smoke at every stop sign. I was always on the Honda-tech car forum and I discovered autocrossing so I searched for a local event. After attending my first event in 2005, I was hooked like most of us. It wasn't until 2008 when I started attending National events and realized I could trophy and that I was a decent driver. I've been to Solo Nationals 4 times before I joined the military. Then I ended up taking a 6-year break from autocrossing. My last 2 years in Iraq, I purchased an A-Street prepped C5 Z06 that I stored at my father's house in MO. I was able to fly from Iraq to the United States twice a year for Spring Nationals and the Solo Nationals. I should have received some sort of trophy for longest traveled to Nationals lol.

What would you like to see Indy Region do in 2021 and coming years?

I would like to see us host more National Solo events, so I wouldn't have to drive so far. We should also consider having an Evolution Driving School here because that's really the best bang for driver improvement with all skill levels.

Outside of SCCA, what is something you really enjoy doing?

We try to go camping as much as possible and sometimes it's difficult to work that around autocross events. This year may be difficult since it seems like everyone's trying to camp and you can't find any open reservations anywhere.

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

This month's conversation is with Chris Robbins, the Director of Region Development for SCCA.

I have known Chris for over 12 years and he is a huge addition to the SCCA National office team. Chris and his wife Michele live in Colorado now but he has lived in Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas and Colorado over the years. Chris grew up in Oklahoma where his Dad worked for a Chevrolet dealer and then a VW Porsche dealer. In 1976, he became the owner of the Porsche Audi Mazda dealership in OKC. Chris has fond memories of 427 Corvettes and early 911 Porsches.

How long have you been a member of SCCA?

This is the third time that I have been a member of SCCA. I was a member in the 70's and then again in the late 80's, early 90's. Each time family and my job got in the way of having fun with the SCCA. In 2007 I purchased a new 2006 closeout Miata and I have been a member ever since. In fact, now I have my dream job working for the Club.

What activities do you participate in with SCCA?

I started out going to races with my Dad and my brother. Then after buying the '06 Miata I got hooked on Solo in the Dallas, TX. area. My first Solo Nationals was in 2009 and I ran CSP. What an experience! I did ok, but knew this was for me. The class was great and the people were even better. The Solo Nationals is a great experience and I would recommend it to all Soloists. The '06 Miata is no longer a daily driver and I have set it up for doing Time Trial events now. I am excited about going to the Time Trail Nationals in June of 2021. I will also be at the Solo Nationals in 2021.

How did you get interested in cars and the SCCA?

As I said my Dad was selling cars for a living so I got the car bug as soon as I could walk and talk. I remember my Dads '67 427 Corvette and thinking nothing could be better. Only to get to drive his 930 Turbo Porsche later when he owned the Porsche dealership. Wow did that Porsche ever handle!! I have been so lucky to drive some of the neatest cars ever available. In 1973 my Dad had George Follmer's 917-10 CAN AM car on his showroom floor for a weekend. I was all over that car, it was a dream come true. My Dad sold his 930 Turbo many years ago but I got a call a few years ago from the guy who purchased my Dad's Porsche. He had just had it restored and was looking to see if we had any memorabilia from when my Dad owned the car. I sent him a box of stuff and even got a chance to drive the Porsche 930 one more time following the Runoffs at Sonoma. The last time I had driven the Porsche was over 40 years ago. It was a real treat to see and drive the car again.

What would you like to see SCCA do in 2021 and coming years?

My background is training. I worked for Southwest Airlines for over 22 years and was a founder and key Leader for Southwest Airlines University. I want to help Regions with consistency in how we do things. Training and sharing ideas will help make the Club stronger. The new Learning Management System (LMS)

we introduced at the 2021 Virtual SCCA Convention will help with training. There are so many positives with the Club right now that I feel we have a very bright future.

Outside of SCCA, what is something you really enjoy doing?

Michele and I love to travel and we love to spend time with our family. We are lucky to have three grandchildren and we get to see them often. With travel we really enjoy taking Cruises. In normal times we would go on at least one cruise a year. We have one planned for April of 2022 and can't wait to go.
