infrastructure. This year we will need to invest in the Bus (maintenance and rear tires) and resolution of PA System issues. To cover the added expense, this season we will have \$2.00 price increase.

The solo program is looking for more teammates to become or support our chief positions. Needs include roles in Timing, Safety, and Course.

Finally, my 2022 season will focus on adding new members to the region through the Solo program, improving the flow of the event, and looking at improving our communication with the drivers during the event with better use of the PA system, Text, and possible local FM Transmitter.

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

This month's conversation is with Brian Mason.

Brian Mason is the new Senior Manager of the National Solo Program with SCCA. He is replacing Howard Duncan who retired as of the end of 2021. Velma and I have had the privilege of knowing Brian for over 30 years. Brian currently lives in the Louisville, KY. area but was born and raised in the Cincinnati, Oh. area. While growing up he lived in Cincinnati, Ft. Wayne, IN. and Reno. NV. Brian worked for Sealed Air as a technician for 25 years. \$2,000 Challenge by Grassroots Magazine

I have always said that "Racing is not expensive, Winning is expensive". Well in 2021 three guys from Indy Region proved me wrong. They went out and won the \$2000 Challenge event put on by Grassroots Magazine and spent less than \$2,000. In fact, they spent just over \$1,450 to win. Chris Kinnaman, Bob Miller and Chris Brake were the architects or "Mad Scientists" behind the car that won the \$2,000 Challenge.

Chris Kinnaman was the one to get the guys started over a year in advance of the competition. Chris had been watching the competition since 2004 and convinced the other two guys they had to do it. In 2019 Chris Kinnaman and Bob Miller each took inexpensive cars to the \$2,000 Challenge event to check out the competition. Lots of ideas started to percolate.

Chris Kinnaman's dream was to take a full-size Ford Crown Vic or Mercury Marquis chassis to use as the basis for their race car. It has a solid chassis, good suspension, lots of power in a V8, big brakes and they are "cheap". Now what to do for a body on the race car. The guys didn't want to just have a frame and roll cage with no body. A body became available for "Free". The body was for a Bradley GT. This was a kit car body out of the 70's. A guy took all of the good parts and wanted to see someone take what was left of the body to make a fun car for the \$2,000 Challenge. This was just what the Doctor ordered for the guys. The guys horse traded some parts and they had a body. Now the Mercury Marquis has a wheelbase of 114" and the Bradley GT has a wheelbase of 94.5" so some work lay ahead.

The guys clipped the frame of the Mercury and were able to make the Bradley GT body fit over it. The width was a little problem but they were able to fix that. The three guys spent 11 ½ months building the car in their spare time as all three had regular jobs and family obligations. They literally were completing the car as they put it in the trailer to go to the competition in Florida. The car drove into the trailer and around the block at Chris K's home; what could go wrong?

The \$2,000 Challenge by GRM has three parts: an autocross, drag strip runs and a concours. First up for the guys was the autocross. You get 6 runs so they each decided to take a run. After three runs, no one had a clean run and they were catching cones underneath the front bumper, destroying the radiator and its hoses. After hours of repairs and lots of water they could do the final three runs. They choose to have the "GRM Pro Driver", Mike Casino, do their final three runs to see how good the car could run. Mike coned on his first run. His second run was blistering fast and as he approached the finish, he spun the car. With five dirty runs the guys were sitting 10th in the autocross. Now it was time for a good run. Mike was conservative but put down a clean run good enough to win the autocross portion of the competition. Now on the Drag Race. The guys changed to some drag slicks in the rear and trimmed the wheel openings for clearance. They were so tired they did not make any other changes to the car. They got to the line for the Drag runs just in time to make a couple of runs. The car ran a 13.0 second run and scared the heck out of Chris Kinnaman, the driver. They had not changed the frontend alignment from the autocross so the car was a handful going through the traps at over 100 mph. Need less to say they did well and ended up 6th in the Drag Race. Now on to the Concours. Bob Miller took over and gave a 3-minute talk on the car. The judges were impressed with the build. The guys needed to finish top ten in the Concours to win overall, Bob's talk got them 2nd place in the Concours. They had done it; they won the Overall for the \$2,000 Challenge event.

In the twenty-year history of the event, they are only the third first year team to have ever won the event. It was a lot of fun talking with the three guys about the competition and the build. From their enthusiasm I know they will be back for another try. It will be hard to beat their first experience in 2021.
