# Sitting in the Garage with:

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

This month's conversation is with Kevin Burns.

The man who is always there but is never seen at Indy Region Solo events. Kevin is the head of our Timing and Scoring for all Solo events. He is the one who has made "Live Timing" possible. Velma and I have known Kevin for just a few years but have enjoyed spending time at Solos and Time Trial events with him. Kevin grew up in Central Indiana and has spent most of his time on the north side of Indy in Westfield. He went to the Westfield High School and lived in Westfield while getting his degree at IUPUI. Today he lives in Westfield but co-owns a company in Carmel that helps utilities and large companies use "Solar" for the source of energy. He loves IT and Solar so he has the ideal job.

#### How long have you been a member of SCCA?

I became a member in 2018. I went to a couple of Solos and did ride alongs with friends and I met a lot of Region members. Soon after that I purchased a Miata so I could start driving myself.

#### What activities do you participate in with Indy Region?

I am very involved with the Solo program and I have gotten hooked on doing Time Trial events. I also volunteered to be a "Member at Large" on the Indy Region Board of Directors for 2022. I have run the National Solo events when Indy Region has been the host Region and I have attended the Time Trial Nationals in Bowling Green, KY.

### How did you get interested in cars and the SCCA?

I have always loved cars. I started watching F1 as a kid and was hooked. I also loved Drag Racing. My Dad and I would go out to the Nationals at IRP every year. In fact, my Dad built a Super Comp car, a 1965 Ford Falcon, to run at IRP. He did not like driving the Drag Car so a friend of his drove the car. He loved working on it and I was always at his side. The car did well but it was a "door car in a rail class". Our doing well was not always appreciated by the competitors. I have found that Solo and Time Trials, while very competitive, are much more social that Drag Racing. My Miata is my first real fun car to drive and I enjoy it very much.

### What would you like to see Indy Region do in 2022 and coming years?

I would love to see more people being involved in our programs and having a bigger turn out for the year end banquet. I want to try and make our Solo events more fun for all by making our FM transmitter work better, our live timing work well and our PA system work better. I hope our social media efforts for the club produce some good results.

### Outside of SCCA, what is something you really enjoy doing?

I am always working. It is that way when you are an owner of a company. I do some projects with electronics on the side. For the most part it is work, SCCA and some electronic projects on the side.

# Sitting in the Garage with:

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

#### This month's conversation is with Larry Metz.

I have known Larry and his wife Carolyn for over 30 years. Larry grew up in Ohio but has lived in Indiana much of his life. He has moved around living in Elwood, Elkhart, Anderson, Fishers and two different times Indianapolis. Larry is retired and now lives on the south side of Indy near Southport. After graduating from Anderson University and Ball State University Larry worked for the YMCA, then changing careers 30 years working for the State of Indiana, as a certified vocational rehabilitation counselor.

Larry was recently written up in SCCA's SportsCar magazine. He has had an interesting assortment of cars over the years and is currently working on building a totally new Solo Vee for Solo events. Many years he did not have the resources for the most competitive cars, some were real basket cases, so he wanted to finally have the very best. List of cars over the years: Spitfire, Triumph TR-4A, Austin 850, Honda 600 sedan, Honda Civic, Formula Saab, Jabro sports racer, formula vee that grew into a Solo Vee, Honda CRX, and some events in a Honda S2000.

Larry is also an avid photographer. I have a poster he made for me from 2011 with 16 different pictures of our CSP Miata from that years Solo Nationals. He contributed photos to Clutch Chatter in the 70's from time to time, and got a few pics in Sportscar in the 80's.

### How long have you been a member of SCCA?

I became an SCCA member about 1967. Then life got in the way so I dropped the membership until rejoining in 1971 to renew every year since, thus 50-year member...

I met a guy in Anderson at a drugstore, back in 1965, who saw my Spitfire, and he told me about autocrossing. I went to a couple of events to check it out and I was hooked. I owned a 1965 Triumph Spitfire and I ran the pants off it. Next, I bought a TR4 and ran it for some years, but did not want to strip it into a pure racer, so got a Honda 600. It was the first of many Hondas, as Carolyn became an active driver also, doing well with a Honda Civic, as divisional champion 2 years and earned a trophy at nationals in 1980! I also had a Saab in a Mod class and then finally got hooked on Formula Vees, of which I had three of them at one time, but now down to just two.

I went to my first Solo Nationals in 1976 in Columbus, OH. It was the first of 17 trips to the Solo Nationals as a competitor. I have also been to four additional Solo Nationals in Lincoln, NE. as spectator and a photographer.

I developed a data base (remember Lotus?) that has most of the details of over 510 solo events that I have competed.

I was the Solo Chair for Indy Region in the late 70's for one year, and helped put together a Solo Series (Valvoline Interserie '78 and '79) between Indy Region and several Sports Car Clubs in the area. Gary Dausch and John Barnett worked hard with me to manage the series for the two years, but we were unable to develop a team to carry it on. I also chaired the meetings for some small independent clubs that worked together to become CSCC Which become an SCCA Region in 1980 using the Walesboro airport in Columbus, IN.

I did consider trying some road racing with a vee, but found that I just did not have the financial resources to be seriously competitive, so I stayed with soloing.

### What activities do you participate in with Indy Region?

I have not competed for about five years in soloing, partly due to trying to build a totally new Solo Vee up to the current rules, and life got in the way as we had to move away from Fishers due to commercial development, and faced a number of unplanned remodeling issues at the present home.

A friend of mine, Brent Cary, has offered to co drive his Corvette to help me get back to running.

### How did you get interested in cars and the SCCA?

My Dad was a minister when I grew up but he was very mechanical as we always went to the new car show in January every year, and he had a variety of cars. He got a VW bug rag top, that I got to borrow when in college, as I really loved that car! Then the Triumphs that I had required special care as most of the English sports cars of that time, so I learned to be somewhat of a mechanic.

### Outside of SCCA, what is something you really enjoy doing?

I am enjoying our new home in Southport, got a dream of a six-car garage, and two acres to expand my peony collection. I updated my camera equipment when I retired, and tried to become somewhat professional, but found I did not want to work that hard, as I just wanted to take pictures that I like and enjoy as an amateur. I use to go hunting with my dad and grandfather when in high school, but not as an adult, so in recent years I inherited the family's guns, so I turned to pistols and target shooting as a <u>brand-new hobby</u> to enjoy.

Thinking of the future:

Rather than totally retiring, I actually want to compete some more soloing, if that is possible, as I now have some physical issues myself and have been involved as a care taker for Carolyn and her limitations. I am hopeful that I can arrange to get free to try a few solo events this year before it snows? As I fear I may be forced to retire from the competition and use my camera to enjoy cars, and just sit around with the old guys at the car shows! Changing tires, loading and unloading a trailer, and standing for hours in the hot sun working on course, is not so easy when you are in your 70's.

# **Notes from the Director's Chair**

# Area 4 Director Update for July 2022

I thought June was going to allow me to take a breath.....but I was mistaken. Yes, I had fewer events to attend in person but there were several more Zoom meetings, EVAC emails to write, etc., so I was still pretty busy this past month.

Next month I will be driving to Kansas City for the BoD meeting on 7/29, 7/30. While there, I will also be sitting in on the CRB meeting on 7/28.

Video Conference Meetings:

- Club Racing Board (CRB) (6/7): Much discussion was had about a new initiative called "Green to Checker" or G2C. A myriad of decisions and policies over the years have led to poor performance on track during Club Racing events. There are just too many sessions that are stopped by a black flag all (BFA) or under full course yellow (FCY) due to an incident on track. G2C will try to change the course away from the trend of too many BFAs and FCYs which diminishes the race experience for all involved. This policy is in the planning phase and I will report the results when the protocols are adopted. While this was discussed by the CRB, rest assured this has also been discussed at the BoD level as well. Changes are coming once we figure out the most effective way to alter the course of the program. More work was done on the face-to-face meeting to be held in July (7/28). The results of CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (6/8): We had guests for part of the meeting (Chris Robbins and Abby Scher) as we discussed how to train and educate the SCCA membership on how to interact with EVs when they participate at events. We tied up some loose ends on the 2<sup>nd</sup> iteration of the SCREV. We are also nearly finished with a package for Production cars and are continuing work on a package for formula cars.

- BSpec Advisory Committee (6/14): The BSAC group had some solid suggestions for how to modify our ESpec rules package.
- > Touring Advisory Committee (6/20): The TAC folks had some sage advice for me on the ESpec rules as well.
- SCCA BoD Team Development (6/22): Those of us new to the BoD were asked to take a Myers Briggs Type Indicator Test. That was done online a couple of weeks ago. The results were revealed during a two hour Zoom call. I had never done this type of personality analysis before. All of this was done to allow the BoD work better together and be a more effective governing body.
- Board of Directors (BoD) (6/27): We had a light agenda since we are meeting face to face next month. We discussed the compensation for the President (Mike Cobb). I gave an EVAC update. We did more planning for our meeting in Kansas City next month. We also received an update on the Haynes lawsuit.
- Production Advisory Committee (6/28): Once again, a subcommittee of the CRB provided some valuable insight on how we should modify the ESpec rules package.

### SCCA Events:

- FSAE @ MIS (6/15-6/17): Man, oh man! What a great time I had at this event. To see so many college kids working together was truly uplifting. There were teams representing schools from all over the country as well as several more from Canada. As Chair of the EVAC, my goal was to see how the EVs were designed and built. To that end, I hung out in the EV inspection area. This allowed me to watch the inspectors go through the EV cars with a fine-tooth comb. Watching them helped me understand how the EVs were wired. I was especially interested in the safety features of the EVs. We are adopting some of these key safety features in our prototype and formula car rules packages.
- WMR SCCA Double Regional @ Grattan Raceway (6/18, 6/19): This event was fun to attend as it brought me back to my roots. I started out as an F&C guy way back when and that's what I did this weekend. I had the pleasure of working with a new member too. It was another chance for me to "pay it forward" so the next generation of SCCA member gets the advice and counsel that I did when I joined.
- I have updated my calendar on the GLDIV website with events I'd like to go to this season. Click <u>here</u> to see where I'll be this summer.
