Indianapolis Region Dogwood Daze Tour RoadRally

We had four cars in three different classes run the Dogwood Daze Tour rally on Sunday, April 23. Everyone did an amazing job and there were many low scores and zeroes at checkpoints. A big thank you to Chuck Hanson for writing an awesome rally for novices and experienced rallyists alike. The Dogwoods were in bloom and the weather was good for the event. Thank you also to Sam Crites for safety checking the rally and to the teams that ran the event. Following are the scores.

Next Up: Putnam Purple Cow Precision

We are trying something new!!! There will be a RoadRally offered in conjunction with the Putnam Park Time Trials on July 1-2. The route will go from Putnam Park to Cloverdale and back. It can be run anytime during the weekend and will help you find a couple of alternative routes to and from Cloverdale. In addition, you will get to see the Purple Cow in Cloverdale.

RoadRally and track events are two different disciplines, but together they can hone some exceptional driving skills. While the goal on track is to go fast, the goal of a RoadRally is to drive with precision and observation. This is demonstrated by getting to checkpoints along the route at the correct times. While it sounds easy, road conditions don't always make it so simple. I can promise you a fun drive on all paved roads (no gravel on this one!)

To make things interesting, live scoring for the RoadRally will be available to view all weekend. If you run the rally and think you could do better, then for a \$10 donation to the rally pot, we will assign you a new car number and you can run the event again. The winners of the event will get 50% of the rally pot, 2nd place will get 30% of the rally pot, and 3rd place will receive 20%.

The only class for this event is Stock. You must use your car's odometer. A simple calculation device is permitted but not necessary. The rally is designed so that you can get a decent score just by following the directions and maintaining the correct speed between checkpoints.

The Freedom of Running Seat of the Pants on a GPS Checkpoint Tour Rally

I've been busy with RoadRally stuff lately but have not had the chance to actually compete in a rally for over a year. So, when rallymaster, Chuck Hanson, said that Sam Crites would Safety Check the Indy Region Dogwood Daze Tour rally so that I could run the event, I was overjoyed! Not only did this give me a much-needed rally boost, but it also let me practice what I've been teaching about running Seat of the Pants (Stock) for a Tour rally with GPS checkpoints and it worked out pretty well.

Chuck Hanson designs his Tour rallies with the Novice rallyist in mind. He has good instructions with mileages for each action and identifies where the checkpoints will be. In addition, he runs a series of several checkpoints between each restart point so that you can speed up or slow down as you get feedback from each checkpoint to be able to score better on the next one.

I asked one of my Indianapolis Region friends and Women on Track promoter, Velma Boreen, to navigate the rally with me and she quickly agreed. Velma's husband, Raleigh found a navigator and they ran Novice class. Velma and I ran Stock. There was one additional Novice car and an Equipped car entered for the event.

On the day of the rally, Velma jumped into my car with notepad and calculator in hand. I told her, "We won't need either of those", and, with an eyebrow raise, she put them aside. Our equipment consisted of the car's stock odometer, a GPS unit mounted low on the driver's side windshield so that both of us could see it, a center mount for route instructions made out of a recycled Christmas wreath door mount, and a cell phone with the Richta Checkpoint App running on a windshield mount on the passenger side of the car.

At the start of the rally, we used the odo check to get used to the instruction layout and check the car mileages against the route instructions, then we set off on our first timed leg. Velma concentrated on looking for landmarks and keeping us on course. She also checked off the instructions on the center board as we completed them and patiently answered my everrepeating question "What was CAST again?" Also added to her duties were reminding me to zero the odometer at each restart after I zoomed off once without doing it. I concentrated on keeping us on the road, maintaining speed, and counting off seconds when we felt we were running a little early.

Velma and I followed a simple routine. We left the start points 6 seconds before the top of the minute and maintained a speed a couple miles per hour above CAST until the first checkpoint. The app would announce the score and Velma would confirm. If we were early, I slowed down. If we were late, I sped up. Using this method we were able to hone in on perfect time and scored a lot of low numbers and zeroes. After one rough leg start, we scored a maximum late at the first checkpoint, so we put a time allowance into the Richta App. We were still late at the next checkpoint, so we entered another time allowance and within a couple checkpoints were hitting low numbers and zeros again. This method left us time to look at the scenery and actually chat a little bit as we drove. It was one of the most enjoyable rallies I have run. When the event was over, we were thrilled to learn that we had placed first overall beating the equipped car by just one second.

In the past, I might have suggested that a newcomer to RoadRally would feel more comfortable running a GTA event for their first rally, but after this experience, I can say with confidence, that running a well-designed Tour rally with GPS checkpoints is enjoyable and suitable for novices as well as experienced rallyists.

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

This month I am talking with two of our C/Street competitors, Michael James and Chris Carson. C/Street locally is one of the hottest contested class with several drivers in different Miatas.

I am going to start with Michael James, the driver who won C/Street in 2022. Michael is fairly new to the club but boy has he caught on to Solo. Michael and his wife Becky live in Pittsboro, IN. He was born and raised in Mt. Pleasant, Iowa in the SW corner of the state. After college he and Becky moved around for his job and in 1995, he found himself in Brownsburg, IN. Notes from the Director's Chair Area 4 Director Update for May 2023

First, I wanted to announce that I am running for a second term as your Director. I would have liked to have made this declaration earlier, but some health issues got in the way. The good news is decisions have been made about my treatment and it will not interfere with my ability to fulfill the position. The last thing I wanted was to have my health hinder my ability to do the job for you. To that end, I will take steps this summer to run again in the fall. I appreciate all the feedback I get from the members and will continue to carry your message to the BoD.

Second, my summer schedule is starting to shake out and I look forward to attending a wide variety of events. I'll volunteer to work some of them, observe some and even compete in a few as well. You can see where I'll be by following this <u>link</u>.

Third, the rubber is about to hit the racetrack for me. After all of the "off season" meetings, travel, Zoom calls, emails, etc., the season begins in earnest this month. By the time you get this, I will have already been an instructor at the Waterford Hills Drivers School (4/29, 4/30). I remember my driver's school back in the spring of 2001. A lot of people helped me get my license and this is a way for me to help "pay it forward" for the next crop of Club Racers.

Lastly, please take a few minutes to fill out a demographic survey for the club. The data collected is completely anonymous and will not be sold. The data gathered is used to attract new partners and sponsors. I'll let the survey describe the details. Please click on this link and help the club.

So, here's what I did this past month.....

Video Conference Meetings:

- ➤ Club Racing Board (CRB) (4/4): With the Club Racing season in full swing, there isn't much "tweaking" of the rules going on. BSpec remains an issue. In order to quench some of the politics within the class, the CRB has taken away the balance of performance (BoP) from the BSpec Advisory Committee (BSAC). A major overhaul of BSpec was recently issued and we hope this will get support within the community. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- ➤ Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (4/12): We invited a guest (Tim Wahl) from motorsportreg.com (MSR) to our meeting. We are in the middle of preparing a document for the registrars on how to format the registration pathway to identify entrants with EVs. This would allow

the region to know who is showing up with an EV so everyone could be prepared. We found out we would not be allowed to use the ISO graphic to identify EVs. As a result, the SCCA needs to come up with its own graphic to use. That project has already begun. We discussed the implications of Summit Point Raceway deciding to not allow EVs on its racecourse for competition. We also discussed some minor changes in the SCREV document as we receive feedback from the membership.

➤ Board of Directors (BoD) (4/24): The financial picture looks good. REALLY bad weather at some early season events reduced income from entries but we expect that to rebound as the weather gets better. This affected both Club Racing and Solo events across the country. We reviewed a proposal on the viability of a face to face, national convention in 2024. In the end, it was decided that there wasn't enough gained for the cost. With dramatically rising costs for travel and accommodation, the cost would have been prohibitive. So, if a face-to-face meeting was off the table, it was decided to apply the resources to the divisional meetings. Look for more support from Topeka for our divisional meeting next spring.

SCCA Events:

➤ Club Racing driver's school at Waterford Hills (4/29, 4/30): Details in next month's update.
