SITTING IN THE GARAGE





Sitting in the Garage with:

(Conversations with Indy Region Members and other significant SCCA members with Raleigh Boreen)

This month's conversation is with the two ladies who started the "Women on Track" Program with SCCA.

In 2017 there was a meeting in Topeka, KS. after the Tire Rack Solo Nationals to discuss the small number of women at the 2017 Championship event. In the meeting were Raleigh and Velma Boreen who were working with SCCA on Solo Program Development. Velma had good information on women's participation in the National Championship going back to 1973. In 2017 the women's participation was at 11%. That was down from a high of 20% and a consistent 15% or more in participation numbers. In 2018 Velma from Indy Region was asked to do a presentation on how to get more women involved in SCCA as competitors, workers or as organizers at the SCCA National Convention. After the meeting David Cook with Mazda approached Velma to let her know Mazda would like to help getting more women involved. As David and Velma were talking, a good friend, Linda Duncan with Central Florida Region, walked by. Instantly the conversation had three people talking and the rest is history. Out of that chance conversation the "Women on Track" program was started. The two ladies talked with Howard Duncan, the Head of Rally and Solo, and got his blessing to go ahead with the "Women on Track" program. Mike Cobb, the President of SCCA was also in agreement. Fast forward to the SCCA National Convention in 2024 and the "Women on Track" program is alive and well. Today there is an executive committee watching over the program and active committees representing all of the activities of SCCA. (Road Racing, Solo, Rally, Race workers, Time Trials and Rally Cross) In 2024 Velma and Linda are stepping down and passing the torch of leadership to Kelsey Karanges and Emily Brown.

How long have you been a member of SCCA?

Velma – I started working races in 1970 at the Trans Am race at Donnybrooke Raceway in Brainard, MN. I joined SCCA in 1976. I worked races consistently from 1970 to 1983. I started autocrossing in 1981 and really got hooked. Currently I am a member of Indy Region.

Linda - I started competitive driving while in college at the University of South Florida. I started in 1982 after I attended my first Solo with my husband Howard. I became only the 2nd women to be the president of the College Sports Car Club. I also worked races and I quickly realized I did not like running from out of control cars. I also did some Timing and Scoring and really enjoyed that. I am currently a member of Central Florida Region.

What activities do you participate in with Indy Region?

Velma - Most of my time with SCCA is spent at Solo's. I Solo a CAM T Camaro. I also have a license to work Road Races. I work at the Time Trail Nationals at NCM each year. I have worked 7 out of the last 9 Runoffs in Registration and Tech. I have been on two of the SCCA Hall of Fame committees and am still very involved in the Great Lakes Division Solo Series. I am the secretary for the SCCA Foundation and I am the treasurer for the Great Lakes Division. I was a member of the Indy Region Board but have stepped down for 2024.

Linda - Right now my time with SCCA is spent going to Solo's. I Solo an STR Miata. I am also trying to figure out what "Retirement is" as I just moved back to Florida where I grew up after being gone for over 30 years. I do enjoy Rally Cross events and try to help with the Street Survival program. Over the years I have done Solo, Rally Cross, Time Trial events, Road Rally and some Road Racing. I keep coming back to Solo.

What was your first car?

Velma – The first car I drove was my mother's 1964 Plymouth Valiant. I then learned how to drive a stick shift on my brother's 1963 Falcon Sprint with a 4spd. The first car that I actually owned was when my husband, Raleigh, and I bought a new 1972 Pinto.

Linda - The first car I had was when I turned 16, I got a used 1963 Simca, an English Ford. It had a stick shift so I was ready to go. It only had 60 horse power so it had problems getting out of its own way.

How did you get interested in cars and the SCCA?

Velma – I got interested in cars through my brother and my husband. I always liked cars and road trips but John and Raleigh had some fun cars. I also come by it quite naturally as my mom's favorite car was a 1970 Dodge Charger! An interesting fact, when Indy Region celebrated their 75th Anniversary in 2019 we had a picnic. Over 150 people came to the event. Everyone was asked to list all of the cars they had owned since they started driving. Raleigh's and my list had 69 cars on it. Our list did not make the top 10 that day.

Linda - My Dad loved cars. He would go to car shows as much as possible and I always went with him. We also went to the Roundy Round tracks as often as possible. We enjoyed stock car racing and midget racing. My Dad also owned a Hobby Shop and he had one of the biggest slot car tracks in the area. It was 8 lanes wide and I spent many hours racing slot cars. In fact, that is where I met my future husband. My husband, Howard, fixed my slot cars then and my competition cars now. I can hand him tools but the fixing is his job.

What would you like to see the "Women of Track" program do in 2024 and coming years?

Velma - We have handed off the leadership of the "Women on Track" program to two very energetic ladies so I know the program is in good hands. I hope it continues to grow and support women in SCCA.

Linda - I agree with Velma; the program is in good hands. It has grown so much over the last 5 years. It has grown well beyond my wildest dreams, even with the Covid interruption. I just hope we can see it grow more in 2024. The SCCA Foundation now funds the program with the help of Mazda so the sky is the limit.

Outside of SCCA, what is something you really enjoy doing?

Velma - Is there life without cars? All kidding aside I love to travel and doing lots of car stuff with my husband and our friends.

Linda - My time outside of SCCA is taken up spending time with my family. I love spending time with my three grandchildren who live close to me. I enjoy traveling with or without the car on the trailer following us. I enjoy my quiet time and I look forward to my walks every day. My quiet time revolves around long walks and doing some gardening in the hot








Indy 2024 Time Trial Schedule

Notes from the Director's Chair

Area 4 Director Update for February 2024

With no report for January, this one has a bit more content. The divisional leadership is gearing up for the upcoming season.

So, here's what I did this past couple of months....

Video Conference Meetings:

- Club Racing Board (CRB) (12/5): Due to a scheduling conflict, I was unable to attend this meeting. That said, the committee reviewed letters as usual and prepared for the upcoming season. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen <u>here</u>.
- Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (12/13): The Chair of the CRB requested that all of the sub committees host a "Town Hall" style Zoom meeting to allow constituents a chance to interact with the committee members. We would host that meeting as our regularly scheduled monthly meeting for December. We tried to reach out to members who would be interested in joining us. Several folks joined our meeting and we had a nice discussion with them on a wide range of topics.
- CRB (1/2): The CRB reviewed the strategy for data collection for 2024. Which tracks, what races, etc. They also had an involved discussion on the future of the Club Racing program. In the end, it was obvious that we need to have a strategic planning meeting in the spring. This will allow us to focus on the long-term planning of the program. I have already started working with John LaRue (CRB Chair) on this. Like every other monthly meeting, the open letters were reviewed as well. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- GLDiv BoD meeting (1/8): We met to discuss how the division could support the introduction of the Flagtronics system at our race events. This is coming in a couple of years and we need to be prepared so regions will be properly equipped to support the program. No decisions were made as this was just an informational meeting. We will discuss it further with the broader membership at our GLDiv Convention in March.
- EVAC (1/10): Final revisions of the latest SCREV update were discussed. These would be passed on to the BoD for review and promulgation. We reviewed pending letters. We also discussed hosting a

town hall type meeting for our December time slot so folks could query us about the committee and its work.

Board of Directors (BoD) (1/29): As we were busy with the convention on our usual date (4th Monday each month), we slid this back meeting a week. We discussed a few items and received reports on a couple more. The financials for the past year are almost complete. Even with a poor start to the year (bad weather holding down car counts at big events), we managed to come out ahead of projections. Even SCCA Pro was ahead of the curve. A select committee was formed to update the BoD handbook and its output was reviewed. We will have a couple of weeks to look through it and offer comment.

SCCA Events: None

The new year also means it's time for your GLDiv BoD to start working on the Convention. This year's event will be held at The Summit in Fort Wayne on March 2nd with a social portion held the evening before. Event details and registration information can be found <u>here</u>. Many of our colleagues from the National Office will be in attendance. Please reach out to <u>Val McCammon</u> if you have any questions, comments or suggestions.

Be sure and visit the <u>GLDiv website</u> for information about all of the SCCA programs within the division. We have schedules, official's contact info, standings, etc. for all the SCCA programs.

Please take a few minutes and make sure your contact information is accurate in the SCCA database. It's important to have the correct information there so the club knows how to contact you. Log in to your <u>my.scca.com</u> page and check.

As I mentioned previously, there is a new path to getting your annual waiver. You can now get it through the Member Account Portal (MAP). Follow this <u>link</u> to get the instructions. - Club Racing Board (CRB) (2/6): The group reviewed the locations for data collection at some of the Hoosier Super Tour events. The use of using a spec ABS system in BSpec was discussed. As the XCRB face to face meeting was approaching, conversations about topics and the agenda ensued. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen <u>here</u>.
- Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (2/22): I brought up two "out of left field" conversations I had over the previous month. One with a fellow from Texas who wanted to electrify a formula car. The other was from the manager of a race track who wanted to investigate if the SCCA could help him host EV only track sessions. We also discussed writing a 'fact sheet" to pass out to regions and venues who might be interested in having events that would hosting EVs. There's a lot of misinformation about EV safety and we need to educate our member regions and event venues on the true issues.
- > Board of Directors (BoD): Due to scheduling issues, we postponed the February meeting.

The BoD has proposed a Bylaws change. You can view the details of the proposal by following this <u>link</u>. Voting has already begun (it started 2/13) and will close on 3/14. The proposed Bylaws change would strengthen term limits on members of the Club who are elected to the National SCCA Board of Directors. Currently, a member in good standing can hold a Director position for two consecutive elected terms before having to step down. However, after being off the Board for a term, the current Bylaws allow that same

person to then run for election to the SCCA Board of Directors again at a later date. The Bylaws proposal would limit members' eligibility to serving a maximum of two elected terms total.

I encourage everyone to vote for this proposal. Voting for this follows the same path as any other vote.

- 1. Go to my.scca.com and log in.
- 2. In the horizontal menu, hold your mouse over "Member Resources" and select "Surveys and Voting".
- 3. Click on the button and cast your vote.
